I was very proud of our Year 2 to 6 students who participated in 'Clean Up Kurrimine Beach' last Thursday as part of our association of being a Reef Guardian School. The prayer, written down in his native dialect goes, "Laudato sie mi Signore, cum tucte le Tue creature" or "Be Praised, my Lord, through all your creatures". We celebrate St Francis of Assisi's feast day on Saturday, 4th October.

Parents will be welcomed on site from 8:45am via the Nature Play area, with the day commencing around 9:00am with team marches and war cries.

Schedule of events for the day:

- 1. 200m followed by Aged Sprints
- 2. Field Events in a round robin order according to ages-long jump, high jump, shotput, novelty events
- 3. Relays
- 4. Presentations.

Parents will have designated areas for spectating around field and track events as well as a home base tent. Please remember to follow the COVID-19 rules below. Parking will be along Harold Street on the day. Hopefully the weather will also be in our favour for the day, however if we must cancel, due to extreme rain, notification will be via our school Facebook page at 8:00am.

Further rules of entry to follow:

- ⇒ If you are currently under an active self-quarantine notice you must not attend.
- ⇒You must comply with all reasonable instructions given by staff members.
- ⇒ Physical distancing of not less than 1.5m from others, (with exceptions for family/household) must be maintained at all times.
- \Rightarrow Please abide by floor markers or signage where these are in place.
- \Rightarrow Hand sanitiser is provided and is to be used.
- ⇒ Please utilise good coughing and sneezing etiquette by coughing or sneezing into a tissue, handkerchief, or the crook of your elbow.
- ⇒ You will be directed to spectate from a designated area.
- ⇒We require you to submit personal information for the purposes of contact tracing. This information will be stored for 56 days, after which it will be disposed of. Information will be provided to Qld Public Health if requested for the purposes of contact tracing and will not be used for any other purpose. Storage, access, use and disposal of information will be in line with our Privacy Policy.


Year 5/6 Camp

While many of the children picked family members for this, we also had police and firefighters flagged as safe people by some of the children. They drew and labelled these people and we created a poster as a reminder

Kindergarten is a time of rich, play based learning; just what our children need to become confident and involved learners. We aim for a literacy rich environment and have observed lots of instances of fantastic literacy development and understanding in the children's play over the past few weeks. Some of these include writing a doctor's list, taking

> letters and names on the interactive white board.
