School water confidence classes have highlighted how important it is to teach your child to swim. Parents have asked me what swimming level is sufficient. Although it can take dedication and time, I recommend teaching children to swim the four strokes and for over 200 metres. This level of swim skill can ensure they are strong enough to handle situations such as a rip, current, fatigue or wet clothing. It was great to see all students having a go and giving it their all. Well done!


#### P & F Lamington Drive and Cook Book.

#### Road/ Bridge Closure.

The Department of Transport and Main Roads (TMR) will temporally close Liverpool Creek



Bridge located on Silkwood – Japoon Road near Japoonvale while important maintenance works are carried out. These works are part of our regular bridge maintenance program to ensure the continued safety and reliability of the bridge.

Work crews will be on site from Tuesday 20 October 2020 from 7am to 5pm. For the safety of road users and maintenance crews, changed traffic conditions under the coordination of traffic controllers will be in place while preparation works are carried out. Expected delays up to 15 minutes.

The bridge will be closed to all vehicle traffic and pedestrian activities from 7am Monday 26

October to Thursday 26 November 2020, weather permitting. The bridge crew will operate on an 11-day working roster, with a 3-day break. The bridge will be closed for 24-hours during the working schedule and fully open during the 3-day crew break.

# Kindy News

This term has been filled with themed weeks. We began with National Space Week and then had National

Nutrition Week. Week 3 was the CBCA Book Week! We have been programming around these themes and encouraging the children to engage in learning with varied provocations of play. We made rockets using paper strips and straws to end our Space Week fun, which doubled as a great science experiment as we worked out how to get them to fly far away. During Nutrition Week we looked at, and created our own Healthy Food Plate. This involved cutting, sorting and pasting, with lots of discussion and reflection on food choices. We also chose recipes to cook and created a yummy banana bread, as well as extra delicious frozen yogurt ice blocks.



During book week we set up play spaces based around books within the theme of 'Curious Creatures, Wild Minds'. We explored 'Piranhas don't eat bananas' by Aaron Blabey, with fruit counters and piranhas added to our playdough table. We made puppets based on the characters from 'The Gruffalo' by Julia Donaldson, and used these in various areas of our room. We re-read a favourite story 'Waranyarra the Rainbow Snake' by the senior boys' class at the Lajamanu school, and then worked on a group craft of this creature. Lastly, we watched a reading of 'Where the wild things are' by Maurice Sendak and created our own wild creatures complete with a creative

description on what they are called, their diet and special features! These are up on our wall now as a 'Wild Creature Museum' so please check them out!

We have StoryPark up and running with lots of stories being added. If you haven't found your emailed invitation to link to our page, please let me know and I can resend it. Parents you are more than welcome to make comments on any stories.
