For those families new to St. John's, our P&F executive committee, with the support of all our parents, have achieved great things recently with the construction of our Nature Play which was designed by the students. I am pleased to inform the community that St. John's Parents and Friends has been successful in a Gaming Grant application. They will be receiving \$34,580 to shade sail our Nature Play area and commence Stage 2 of this project construction, which will include further design elements. Many thanks, also to Mrs Riera and Mrs Sendra who coordinated the successful Gaming Grant application.

Yesterday at our P & F meeting we were also joined by Mrs Kirsten Brooks who was representing the Silkwood Tennis Club. Unfortunately, this Club has now ceased operating and Mrs Brooks, on behalf of the club, donated \$46,287 to the St. John's P&F Association. Palm Sunday (28th March) The Sunday before Easter Sunday marks the beginning of Holy Week. This day commemorates Christ's triumphant entrance into Jerusalem.



Holy Thursday (1st April) is the day when Jesus sat down at the table sharing his Last Supper with his disciples. The Eucharist originates from Jesus' words and actions at this meal.

**Good Friday (2nd April)** is the day on which we commemorate the death of Jesus Christ on the Cross, the act that brought salvation.

**Easter Sunday (4th April)** is the greatest feast in the Christian calendar. On this Sunday, Christians celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead. It is a day of celebration because it represents the fulfilment of our faith.

This year our enrolment process will be elevated to Term 2 and 3 to line up with Catholic schools in the Diocese and our CES commitments and deadlines.




#### **Uniform Shop**
