On Monday, along with the School Captains, I attended the National Mass, celebrating a significant milestone of **200 years of Catholic Schooling in Australia** at St. Monica's Cathedral, Cairns. Bishop James captivated the audience at Mass by sharing his memories of school, and also stated the key role of modern **Catholic Schools is to provide wisdom and knowledge to our students.** He also stated 'We stand on the shoulders of giants'

acknowledging the hard work and dedication of all those gone before us, including the Franciscan Missionary Sisters at St John's.

#### **Upcoming Feast Days**

This Sunday, the Church celebrates News the **feast of the Holy Trinity**. The simple and profound truth at the heart of Trinity Sunday is that 'God is Love'. God, therefore, cannot be alone. Love requires

someone who loves, one who is loved and the fruit of that love. If God is love, then God the Father is the one who loves, God the Son is the one who is loved, and the fruit of that love is God the Holy Spirit. Humans struggle to make sense of the Trinity, of three in one. That is why we say the Trinity is a mystery, as no-one can fully understand it.

The Sign of the Cross and the Glory Be are two prayers that connect us with the Trinity.

Next Sunday is the feast of the Body and Blood of Christ. This feast is about the Eucharist as a sacrament of unity. When we break bread and share the one cup, we recall the last supper before Jesus died on the Cross. Like the disciples, the Mass has bounded us in a love relationship. For this reason, the Eucharist is a call to unity and community.

#### Know Your Saint - Saint Norbert

As a lazy nobleman, St Norbert loved good food and wine. After being thrown from his horse in a storm, he changed his life and became a priest. He founded several monasteries and convents in his time.

#### **Interhouse Athletics**

With cross country done completed for another year, our students now turn their efforts to Athletics. They are currently busily honing in on their Athletics skills with Mr. Russell. Last fortnight, St. John's was fortunate to have secured a visit from Mr Shaun, a Development officer from Little Athletics. to coach our students. Mr. Shaun gave the students some vital tips on all the field events.

Our Interhouse Athletics is set for Thursday 24th **June.** The students love to see their parents cheering them on so please mark this date in your calendar.

#### E-Learning Lessons at St. John's with Mrs Irvine.

On Thursday, all students will have the opportunity to explore learning through virtual reality (VR) and augmented reality (AR) as part of our eLearning program. VR enables students to immerse themselves in environments they would not usually be able to explore - think diving on the

Great Barrier Reef, huddling with the penguins in Antarctica, or visiting cultural and religious festivals in far off places. AR enables students to use the camera function on smartphones/ ipads/laptops to add digital elements to

a live view of the real world. Just look out for the dinosaurs popping up in the library! Years 4 to 6 students will also use Merge explorer—an AR app which transforms a cube into a digital canvas - to explore the galaxy or terraform the Earth in the palm of their hand! We will be joined by Anna Seidi, the Digital Learning and Library Services Consultant from Cairns for this exciting day of learning.



Rindry News At Kindergarten we help the children to develop the skills they will need when they move into formal

schooling. Building on our **fine motor skills** is a really important part of early childhood development – **increasing strength in our hands, fingers and wrists helps us in life** – from being able to open our lunches, to dressing ourselves, to drawing and writing. In Kindergarten we work on these skills in lots of different ways. Manipulative equipment like Duplo and Lego, playdough, scissors and tongs, dress-ups, painting and drawing; all of these experiences build on the children's fine motor dexterity. **Our drawing/writing table has been a busy place** recently with some great pictures being created. We have also drawn and written, with water, on our tough tray and blackboard, and offered a "Space" themed drawing and writing provocation on the blackboard for the children to interact with.

Also at Kindy, as part of our exploration into the Punjabi culture, we have learnt how to count to 10 in Punjabi, and have posters on our wall with numbers written in both English and Punjabi. The children interact with these in their play by counting out the pictures, working on their numeral recognition, reading the posters from left to right and of course practising the Punjabi numbers in words.
