

## Celebrating Queensland Catholic Education Week 25th July to 31st July

Each year, we celebrate Catholic Education Week in Week 3 of Term 3. This year, we will join with other Catholic schools from the Southern Deanery for a whole day celebration focused on the theme *A Spirited Tomorrow,* which acknowledges the long tradition of Catholic Education and its continued relevance in preparing students for the future. More information about this celebration will be available early next term.

#### **Know Your Saint - St Thomas More**

St Thomas More was born in London in 1478. He became a lawyer and was made Vice Chancellor of England by King Henry VIII. He was beheaded by the same King in 1535 because St Thomas refused to swear loyalty to him after Henry broke away from the Catholic Church for divorcing his wife.

#### **Understanding Student Report Cards**

Overall, **reporting of students' achievement** in Prep to Year 3 is reported as Very High, High, Sound, Developing and Support Required. For students in Year 4 to 6 overall achievement is reported as A – E. A '**Sound/C'** rating will mean that a child is at the expected standard at the time of reporting and that his or her learning is on track.

A 'High/B' rating will mean that a child is above the standard expected for their year level at the time of reporting.

A 'Very High/A' rating will mean a child is well above the standard expected for their year level at the time of reporting.

A 'Developing/D' rating will mean a child is below the standard expected at the time of reporting, and a 'Support/E' rating well below.

Problems may occur through adults' perception of A-E Reporting. When adults (you and me) were in school, the report A-E Report system meant something totally different. The definitions have changed, especially for the achievement level of 'C'. A grading of 'C' means that your child, at this point in their learning is progressing at the expected level for that year level. It means the child is on par with a 'typical' child in Australia, which is a worthy achievement. What teachers are now looking for in an 'A' student is a child who has shown a deep understanding of a topic and possesses the ability to apply that information in an unfamiliar context without adult assistance. Simply achieving 100% or close to it on a spelling or maths test doesn't automatically equate to an 'A'.

#### **Term 3 School Fees Discounts**

Catholic schools in the Diocese of Cairns provide a discount on tuition fees for holders of means-tested concession cards. The discount applies to tuition fees and not to school levies. The cards must be current and list, as dependents, the students for whom the discount is sought. Families who have recently acquired such a card are eligible for concessions by completing an application, available from the school office and supplying a copy of their card by **Tuesday 12th July for inclusion for Term 3 fees**. Pease note: Any applicants with an expired card are also required to re-apply before the Term 3 school fees are generated.




Rindy News It is hard to believe Term 2 is at an end! The Kindergarten children have been so busy playing and learning.
