Dear Parents.

A sincere thank you to all parents for your participation in my **Principal Appraisal process** which has been most rewarding and worthwhile. All principals who serve 5 years at a Catholic school undergo this process. The panel advised me last Tuesday that my appraisal was extraordinary and **highly successful**. Survey data and feedback from parents and staff show an **enormous amount of trust in my leadership** at present and into the future. I am **humbled by this feedback**. I'm proud to have so much passion in

leading St. John's School. The panel members also commented on the love and care displayed in the school community. They said the school culture seemed amazingly vibrant, with staff and students immensely enjoying school life. The panel also passed comment on how respectful and well-mannered the students presented. Thank you parents for working in partnership with the school to nurture this in our students.

This Friday is **World Teachers' Day**. As you know, in order to be a great leader you must have a dedicated and great team working alongside you. So, on behalf of the St. John's Community, I say a huge **thank you to our teachers and school officers**. I see first hand the dedication, time and care our staff give to your child/ren. As a parent, I am so grateful that my child/ren have wonderful adults guiding them through their schooling journey. Please reach out to your child's educators and say thank you this week.

St. John's has celebrated academic success and growth in our **NAPLAN results**. With **100% student participation**, the Year 3 & Year 5 students completed these tests on their devices whilst being supervised by Mrs Daly and myself. Results are:

- Year 3 Numeracy was above state average and on par with national average.
- Year 3 writing was also above state average.
- ♦ Year 5 reading was strong, also being above state average.
- ♦ Year 5 showed strong growth in spelling & reading and was above state and national

Overall, there was a positive increase in many areas. I remind parents that you can always make an appointment to discuss academic results with your child's class teacher.

Remember to complete the **school satisfaction survey**. A link was emailed to parent email accounts and must be **done by Wednesday 3rd November**. Survey results will be collated by an independent firm that will report back to Catholic Education.

There is **great excitement** at school this week! The St John's Rugby League team will be versing sister school St Rita's today at 1:30pm. Prep to Year 3 students are heading off on their day excursion to Innisfail on Friday whilst Year 4 to 6 will wear a red t-shirt to promote awareness for Day for Daniel and student protection.

Growth Mindset

Without the right tools and strategies, many children get stuck in a fixed mindset. A fixed mindset is the belief that our abilities, talents, and intelligence are static. We are either good at something or we aren't. This way of thinking is limiting and holds children (and adults) back from reaching their full potential. A growth mindset is the belief that our abilities, talents, and intelligence can grow or change through effort and perseverance. A growth mindset equips children with the skills to work through challenges, set and achieve goals, and think creatively. It boosts selfesteem and encourages educational risks.


Growth Mindset Continued

Here are some tips for how you can support children through this process:

- ⇒ Use and encourage language that reflects your own growth mindset. For example, instead of saying, "I can't do it" to your child, try saying, "I'm still working on improving".
- ⇒ Accept mistakes as learning opportunities. Share examples of your own mistakes and discuss how you were able to learn and grow as a result.
- Help children regulate emotions. There are a lot of uncomfortable emotions associated with trying new things, making mistakes, and failing. Some simple strategies for regulating these emotions include taking deep breaths, counting to ten and back, going for a short walk, and drinking a glass of water.
- Give praise for effort, creativity, and problem solving. Recognise growth, rather than just achievement.
- **Encourage curiosity.**
- Familiarise yourself with the **brain science** behind a growth mindset and remind children as they struggle that their brain is growing and changing.

The shift from a fixed mindset to a growth mindset isn't easy. It involves risk taking and requires children to try and fail and try again. Practising a growth mindset can help children to tackle just about anything.

They learn how to foster a "can do" attitude and



celebrate their mistakes as a path to ultimate success.

Kindy News

Term 4 is racing along! Please keep an eye out in your emails for our calendar with important end of term dates. We have

quite a bit happening over the last 3 or 4 weeks of the term; including an excursion, Christmas parties, graduation day and a rolling working bee.



The Kindergarten aged children will also soon have a Transition Statement prepared for them. This is a strengths based assessment of the children based on the Learning and Development Areas of the Queensland Kindergarten Learning Guidelines. Families are able to give permission to share this with the school they have enrolled in for Prep as a way to help the school to get to know your child. These statements will be emailed out to families in Week 7 to read, and then consent to share or not to share will be requested by Week 8.





At the moment at Kindergarten we are exploring our Community and collating our ideas on what we know about our local areas onto a big map. One aspect of our community that the children are quite knowledgeable on and interested

in is the sugar mill, cane farms and most of all the harvesters! The children worked together to create

their own sugar mill to play with at Kindergarten, and sent in photos of harvesters they have seen or have at their farms. They also discussed and drew pictures about other things they see in their community - pigs, kangaroos, stingrays, sharks, snakes, trees, flowers and the pub:). It is important to know about the community we live in; understanding the unique aspects of where we live, and developing an understanding of our place within it.
