Dear Parents,

What an amazing start we have had to the school year. Each classroom is humming with busyness as students engage fully in their learning. It is wonderful to have the students back.

joined our school community. Another special welcome to **Mrs Murphy** who is completing her 4th year placement as a pre-service teacher. I would like to thank our teachers for their commitment to professional learning. In the week prior to school resuming, teachers engaged in learning around topics such as Religion, Reading and Mathematics. Their focus on learning, with the goal of offering all of our students "a world class education enriched by their lived encounter with the Catholic faith" (Cairns Catholic Education Community, Strategic Directions, 2021-2025) is admirable.

Another of our professional learning days was focused on the "Clarity" work which began last year. This project will continue this year. Clarity is an approach to teaching and learning, focused on improving the outcomes of all students. This year, Case Management Meetings, putting "Faces on the Data" and Learning Walks and Talks will be incorporated into the schedules of teachers and leadership. **Case Management Meetings** require teachers to share their ideas on how to improve the work of a selected students. Usually, these suggestions can be used for many other students both within the student's class and across the school. Putting "**Faces on the Data**" allows teachers to examine the data of each student in their class and target their teaching groups of students according to needs. When leadership undertake a **Learning Walk and Talk**, they can ascertain the effectiveness of the processes teachers are implementing in their classrooms and identify areas that require increased focus. I am excited to pick up the work already completed around "Clarity" and work with teachers and school officers to move the project forward.

A reminder that **Parent Information sessions** are being held next week. Check your Parent Flyer for details.

I would like to take this opportunity to invite you to our **Opening School Mass** next **Wednesday at 9:00am**. This Mass is a wonderful opportunity to welcome our new students and introduce our 2023 captains and student leadership team. A **Welcome Morning Tea** will follow the Mass. I hope you can join us.

Finally, thank you for allowing me to lead St John's as Acting Principal for the next six months. I look forward to your ongoing support.


From your School Counsellor Miss Jo.

Welcome back to School for 2023! 'Growth begins at the end of our comfort zone'.

I hope you have had a welcome holiday break and are ready to resume the rhythm of school. I am excited to be returning as your School Counsellor this year and will be available Wednesdays and Thursdays in 2023.

Returning to a structured day with time frames, lunches to prepare and tasks to complete can bring challenges and adjustments for all of us. Be kind to yourself and your children as we all adjust to the timetable of school days. Take a breath, find tolerance within, role model patience and kindness to start the year with a positive smile.

With renewed adjustment, big emotions can emerge to test our resilience. This is natural and expected. There are a range of automatic and unconscious reactions that are best supported with acknowledgement and acceptance. When you see those big feelings emerge in your child, take time to connect before correcting, name those feelings, give space and guidance, so children feel heard and reassured. Messages of safety, bravery and reassurance are important right now. True resilience begins when we can learn to embrace those 'big' feelings, followed with opportunities to tame them. Author Neale Walsch wisely tells us that 'Growth begins at the end of your comfort zone'. So, let's embrace the challenges ahead, no matter how uncomfortable they can seem. 2023 is going to be wonderful.

Making kindy cheaper from 2023

From 1 January 2023, the Queensland Government will introduce new kindy funding to give every child a great start. Kindy will be cheaper for many families and for some it could be free - it doesn't matter if your child attends a sessional kindy or a kindy program in a long day care.

Find out how much you can save

- See if you're eligible f or Kindy plus Kindy may be free!
- Are you receiving Family Tax Benefit? 2 Kindy is cheaper!

What is kindy and when can my child start? Kindergarten is a Queensland Government approved program for children who are at least four years of age by 30 June. The Queensland Government kindy funding is for childre attend a kindy program for at least 15 hours a week or 30 hours a fortnight over 40 weeks a year.

Nurturing your joy

We like to start the year off by ensuring everyone feels comfortable and secure at Kindy. We are currently sharing and displaying photos of our family a wonderful part of our room environment that stays up all year, and allows the children to share their family members with their friends, and also to look at and gain comfort from if needed. If you haven't sent in family photos yet please do!

We are also helping all the children to begin to recognise their name. We have a poster on our fridge where the children can find and add their names every day. We also offer their name cards when they are doing art and either write their name or encourage them to have a try of this. We've got name cards on our mail pockets in our room, and are busy decorating name posters to use during our Kindy days! When we are writing the children's names we use a capital letter to start, and then lower case letters for the rest of the name. It is wonderful if families can do the same at home to have consistency in how their children view their names.

We have a few spaces left in our Kinder group, so if you have a friend of family member who has been thinking of enrolling please let them know. This year the government has various funding strands to help Queensland families out with the cost of Kindergarten.
