Dear Parents/Carers,

This week, I have the great pleasure of welcoming Victoria and her family to our school community. Victoria is in Year 2 and has enjoyed her first few days at St John's.

The Sacraments of Confirmation and First Eucharist were very special evenings, celebrated in the presence of family, friends and parishioners. I thank Mrs Daly for facilitating the program for our Parish, and I once again congratulate our sacramental recipients: Cooper, Jorji, Emily P, Tilly, Erin and Porsha.

Tomorrow, Ned, Audrey, Sean and Wyatt will travel to St Andrew's Catholic College in Cairns to compete in the Reader's Cup. For several months, these students have been reading a series of texts to prepare for this event. As a team, they will be required to answer a series of quiz questions about the books they have read. I thank Ms Irvine for supporting the children's preparation and for taking the time to travel to Cairns with them. We wish them the very best of luck.

I am extremely excited about the Dance Showcase next Friday night. The progress the students have made with their dances is remarkable. With our theme of World Dance Party we are in for a feast of multiculturalism. The evening will begin with a shared meal. We are asking each family to bring a plate of main meal food to share and, following on with our theme, we ask that your dish be from your cultural background if possible. The evening will begin at 6:00PM.

Students have also been busy preparing for our upcoming Interhouse Athletics Carnival. 



From your School Counsellor.....Miss Jo.

A new report by the Australian Institute of Family Studies (AIFS) has found that if a child is involved in volunteering before the age of 13, the odds of having poor mental health are reduced by around 28%.



As well, children who demonstrate 'prosocial' behaviours, such as caring for others or doing acts of



kindness, were 11% less likely to experience mental ill-health. The data was collected as part of Growing Up in Australia: A Longitudinal Study of Children (LSAC) which has been following the development of 10,000 children since 2003.

AIFS researcher, Karlee O'Donnell, said the findings indicate that parents should encourage their children to volunteer in the community, particularly in the pre-teen years. "Volunteering is one way for children to develop their prosocial skills as it provides the opportunity to care for others, show kindness and learn to take on others' perspectives.", O'Donnell said.

Volunteering can take many forms, such as helping at a local community sports club, participating in a community working bee, or more formal volunteering with a charity or church group.

"It's the act of helping others in the wider community, and building empathy and understanding, that is a critical protective factor against mental ill-health.", O'Donnell said.

Kindy Corner ...

Last week we were very fortunate to have Lucille's dad, who is a Mamu man, come in and share some of his culture with us. First he told us a bit about what he does in his job as a Ranger with the Mamu Aboriginal Corporation. Then he showed us how to paint different Aboriginal symbols. We learned how to paint people, boys, girls, mountains, water, meeting place, cassowary and wallaby prints and tracks. He shared how symbols could go together to create a story, and he also showed the group how to do dot painting.



The children tried painting their own symbols, and then dot painted onto their handprints that we had prepared to create our Sea of Hands as part of Reconciliation Week. The Sea of Hands is an iconic symbol of Reconciliation and shows our recognition of Indigenous Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander identities, culture and history. Thank you to Duane for sharing your time, culture and skills with us, and thank you to the students at St Johns school for contributing to our Sea of Hands.


