Dear community members,

Welcome to the 2025 school year. It is wonderful to be back and see the faces of the most important people at St John's, the students. I give thanks to God for keeping them and their families safe over the holiday period. I especially welcome our new students Temperance, Salvatore, Michaela, Clancy, Bailey, Archie, Hazel, Sophia and Ryan to St John's. I hope you and your family make many happy memories with us.



We welcome **Mrs Rachelle Salleras** to the St John's team. Mrs Salleras will take up her position as the Year 3/4 co-teacher next week. She will teach the class five days a fortnight. Ms Danielle Millard is also a new face at St John's. Ms Millard is a fourth year student teacher. She is with us for three weeks this term and five weeks next term. It is such an honour to support our up and coming teachers as they learn more about and practice being in this very important role.

The weather has proven to be consistent for this time of the year. Downpours are confining us to the undercover area for play and even having some of us leave early, or not come to school at all for fear of being unable to return home. Our prayers go out to those who have been effected by the floods particularly in Ingham.

At St John's, we are guided by our four core Gospel values: FAITH, COMMUNITY, COMPASSION, and RESPECT. Through a process of consultation last year, community members (students, staff, parents, parishioners) made a clear statement that these are the most important values for our school. These values have been used to guide the construction of a Behaviour Matrix which describes expected behaviour in different settings within the school. Establishing the matrix as our way of being and teaching expectations provides universal support for our students. Acknowledgement of expected behaviour Wednesday 12th February reinforces the priority of our Gospel values and the goodness of each student.

At St John's, we are committed to addressing student protection concerns promptly and sensitively. While students are encouraged to approach any staff member if they have worries or do not feel safe, Mrs Daly and I are the designated Student Protection Contacts. As well as being available for students to report concerns, our role is to support students, staff, and parents in fostering and maintaining a child-safe organisation. If you have any questions or concerns about student protection, see Mrs Daly or myself.

Tomorrow, students in Years 3 to 6 and staff will elect our 2025 School Captain, 2025 Francis House Captain and 2025 MacKillop House Captain. I wish all students standing for election the best of luck. In the interest of transparency, know that I will abstain from voting for any position my daughter puts her name forward for. We will officially welcome our new leaders at our Opening School Mass next Wednesday. All are welcome to attend the mass, and I invite you to stay after the mass for a Meet and Greet.

This Friday, we have the honour of welcoming Bishop Joe who is visiting to meet the staff and students and to see our school in action. Bishop Joe has spent time visiting several parishes and schools since his ordination, becoming acquainted with the diocese. He will also preside at mass in Silkwood on Saturday night. Details of this and a shared meal can be found overleaf. I encourage you to embrace the opportunity to meet him.

Remember, teachers will host Parent Information Sessions next week. This is an excellent opportunity to learn about the day to day running of the classroom and expectations of your child's teacher. I encourage you to attend these sessions. Check the Diary Dates (adjacent) for days and times.
