Although the word "Christmas" is never used in scripture, the word itself means "Christ's Mass," a day (and season) to remember the birth of Jesus. When we look at typical artwork of the birth of Jesus it is



interesting to know that this scene is a combination of two different stories. Only the Gospels of Matthew (1:18-2:23) and Luke (1:26-2:40) offer narratives regarding the birth of Jesus, and when we compare these two stories, we can clearly see they are written with a different purpose in mind.


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We most often, at Christmas, read the story of Jesus' birth from the Gospel of Luke. In that account we encounter Mary and Joseph, the trip to Bethlehem, the manger scene, and the angels and shepherds. Only in the Gospel of Matthew do we find the Magi (Wisemen/Kings) who followed the star.

Matthew's Gospel has an emphasis on Jesus' ancestry and reflects his desire to show Jesus as the fulfillment of Israel's story. He highlights Jesus as the new David with his birthplace in Bethlehem and his links as a direct descendent. Joseph hears from angels through Old Testament prophecies that are shown to be fulfilled in Jesus. Indeed the whole account is littered with references to the Old Testament, again highlighting Jesus' Jewish roots. By contrast Luke's focus is on showing how Jesus is different from John the Baptist. The author goes to great pains to explain John's identity as one 'to make ready a people prepared for the Lord' and a 'prophet of the Most High'. This is pointedly contrasted to Jesus who 'will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High'. The shepherds are told a 'Saviour has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord'. If readers are still in any doubt of Jesus' identity. Luke finishes his nativity account with the visit to Simeon who described Jesus as God's 'salvation, which you have prepared in the sight of all nations'.

Like all authors, Matthew and Luke wrote with specific purposes and audiences in mind. Each wanted to tell Jesus' story in his own way - to highlight themes of Jesus' ministry, and to emphasise parallels between Jesus' ministry and Old Testament history. Thus, the Christmas story as we know it is not to be taken literally but to be regarded as a sacred myth, explaining who Jesus was for people at that time.

I wish everyone a very Happy Christmas and on behalf of the Justice Squad I would like to thank all families for their generous donations to our
