Dear Parents and Carers.

Last week, principals and senior leaders farewelled **Mr Bill Dixon**, Executive Director of Catholic Education Diocese of Cairns (CEDC). Bill, who has lead Catholic Education in Cairns for the past ten years, will retire at the end of the year. During Bill's tenure, many forward-thinking initiatives have been implemented. Many of these have provided great financial support for parents seeking a Catholic education for their children including reduced fees for Concession

Card Holders and reduced fees for our small, rural schools. On behalf of our school community, I express my deepest thanks to Bill for his inspiring leadership and wish him a retirement filled with God's blessings.

Our P&F is now running their annual lamington drive. The lamingtons are made by parents on the day of delivery (Thursday, 21st November) and are always delicious. I recommend keeping a dozen or two in the freezer for those days you want an easy treat for yourself or the kids. Community members can order their lamingtons through school families or at the school office. Orders are due on Thursday 14th November.

Over the past weeks, I have been reviewing our School Annual Improvement Plan (SAIP) with teachers and consultants from CEDC. While not all data for thorough analysis is available yet, I am pleased with the progress we have made towards achieving our goals to date. Goals for 2025 are now under construction. Always at the centre of mind when creating our goals is student well-being and learning I look forward to communicating more about our SAIP in the future.

Planning for classes in 2025 is also underway. I ask parents to notify me if there will be a change in family circumstances that will impact on their child's enrolment at St John's next year. If you know any families considering St John's for their children in 2025, please encourage them to call the school office to organise a tour of our school. Alternatively, they can submit an online enrolment through our school website. For Prep students, draw parents' attention to the dates for our Pre -Prep and Bump-Up mornings (see Diary Dates adjacent). Attendance on these days will help their transition to "big school".

Our last five weeks of 2024 will be over before we know it. We have many important events coming up, so please ensure you have them marked on your calendars. The first major whole school event will be the disco on Friday 22nd November from 6pm. Dinner options will be shared closer to the date. I'm very excited about wearing my FLURO!

Reading remains an important factor of success at school and children are always very excited to purchase books from the fair. Take time to browse the collection. The cane season is in full swing and December looms, bringing with it heat and humidity. It can be a stressful time of year. Managing stress during this time is essential.

YOU CAN TOTALLY DO Michael Bernard from the 'You Can Do It' foundation (2024) reminds us that our mindset will help us remain resilient in the face of countless stressors at this stage of the school year and highlights several key components.

- ♦ Self-acceptance is crucial. Don't be overly self-critical. No one is perfect. Accept imperfections as part of the learning process.
- ♦ Self-compassion helps us with kindness during difficult moments, which reduces the emotional toll of high-pressure situations like challenging student behaviour or critical feedback from others.
- ♦ An optimistic outlook helps us shift the focus from problems to solutions, enabling us to see setbacks as temporary and surmountable rather than overwhelming.
- ♦ GRIT, the passion and perseverance to pursue long-term goals, enables us to stay committed to our mission, even when faced with excessive workloads or lack of support. This long-term dedication fuels our ability to push through challenges, not out of sheer endurance but purpose-driven motivation.
- ◆ Finally, a growth mindset empowers us to view difficulties as opportunities for development. Instead of seeing these moments as signs that we'll never get on top of these problems and obstacles, we can see them as a natural part of growing personally and professionally. Crafting! Our Kindergarten has a well-stocked craft area. We ensure this area has lots of different resources for the children to be creative and imaginative with. Paper, cardboard, pencils, scissors, paint, glue, magazines, boxes, lids, corks, patty pans, feathers; all sorts of interesting items that can

spark ideas and planning in the children's minds. Within this play there are so many learning and development benefits. The children can develop skills in fine motor, early numeracy and literacy, critical thinking, resilience, social interactions, communication, self-expression, problem solving, bilateral coordination and spatial reasoning! We also use this space to reinforce our sustainability teachings, as the children reuse cleaned items from their lunchboxes – like yogurt containers and bring in things from home that may be headed for the bin.

At the moment we are seeing a lot of interest in transportation emerging in the craft area. The children have created an ambulance, train tracks, space suits, space shuttles, a boat and of course a harvester!

We'd like to offer a big thank you to Margaret Fontana who brought in her guinea pigs to show the Kindergarten group. At meal times the children sort food scraps for our worm farm, and for Margaret's animals. Meeting some of the lovely creatures that eat our scraps was a great reminder of why we do
