Today is Ash Wednesday which marks the beginning of Lent. We gathered together this morning as a faith community to commemorate this special day. We received ashes on our foreheads as a reminder that we are always able to make amends and turn back to God. This is a ritual that all are invited to join. I was proud of the students' reverence and respect during our liturgy, and I thank the parents and parishioners who joined us.

## From your School Counsellor.....Miss Jo.

Bullying is someone more powerful saying or doing something hurtful on purpose over and over again (kidshelpline 2025). It is repetitive, mean, on purpose behaviour that is **never** okay and not acceptable at St John's School Community. Bullying is not the same as rude, conflictual, or mean behaviour, but still requires our support and response:




- ◆ Rude behaviour is saying or doing something hurtful that wasn't planned or meant to upset someone. When we see rude behaviour, call it out "Hey we don't act that way at St John's. Stop being rude."
- Conflict is saying hurtful things on purpose due to heightened emotions as part of a disagreement. When we see conflict, support repair relationships restorative regulation and through conversations and consequences.
- Mean behaviour is saying or doing something hurtful to someone on purpose once or twice. When we see mean behaviour, ask ourselves what does that person need to learn? Is it tolerance, self-control or how to be kind? Call it out "Hey be patient / kind / tolerant. This is how we treat each other at St John's."

Everyone has a right and responsibility to be safe in their community; and it is up to all of us to call out antisocial behaviours and teach each other about what is and what isn't safe behaviour.
