Dear community members,

Today, I must begin with a reflection of our amazing Glow Show and Movie night. What a wonderful success! The excitement was palpable all evening. The popcorn and lollies were a great crowd pleaser and when the lights went on for the Glow Show at the movie's intermission....WOW! The delight of children and adults alike was a joy to behold. I thank all in the school community who contributed to the success of the evening and to all for coming together and creating amazing memories.

Last week, Mrs Daly, Mrs Parisi and I engaged in a DIBELS Data Analysis professional learning day. We spent time deepening our understanding of how to act and respond to the data we collect through the reading screener. Analysing the data helps us identify what isn't working and what is working in our teaching instruction and therefore what we need to change and what we can keep doing. Our focus is always our students and improving their educational outcomes. It was pleasing to see much of what we are doing is working. We have a strong support system in place for students who find learning to read challenging. We also identified a change we can make to our instruction, and I look forward to working with teachers to ensure this becomes a regular feature of our newly implemented literacy blocks.

On Friday, our Year 6 students travelled to Good Counsel College for the Catholic Education Diocese of Cairns Student Voice Forum. The students, together with students from Good Counsel Primary, St Rita's South Johnstone and St Rita's Babinda discussed what it means to be a student in a Catholic school today and building positive student-teacher relationships. The diocese understands that students deserve to be represented in discussions and decisions and the forum allowed students to do this. In term 3, the students will have an opportunity to gather in Cairns with students from across the diocese for another forum.

Congratulations to all students who participated in the Cross Country today. Our preparation leading into the event was not ideal because of the persistent rain, but everyone gave it their best effort regardless. Results can be found overleaf. Selected students will represent St John's at the Cassowary Coast Cross Country early next term. Thank you to all who came along to support the children and make the event special for them.

Tomorrow, our Year 4 to 6 students will travel to Tully for a Touch Football Gala Day. I wish them a fun day and all the best in their games.



Always: be Bigger Stronger, Wiser and Kind Whenever possible: Follow our children's need Whenever necessary: Take charge

- ⇒ If we want our kids to have good self-esteem: Play together. Laugh together. Talk together. Love them unconditionally. Let them know they are special
- ⇒ **Be strong**: Recognise when they are upset, sad or angry. Help talk about and manage feelings together. Love them. Protect them.
- ⇒ Be able to trust: Set clear limits. Be committed. Be bigger, stronger, wiser and kind.
- ⇒ **And to show respect**: Listen to them. See things through their eyes and teach empathy. (Cooper, Hoffman, Marvin and Powell, 2015)
