Dear community members.

Welcome to the end of Term 3. We have had many wonderful things to celebrate this term.

Let me start with our **Dance Showcase** which incorporated a celebration for our **dads** and those who are like fathers to us. Our focus for dance this term was line dance. We are blessed to have wonderful teachers who embrace

the teaching of this discipline. I congratulate the students for their focus and attention while learning the dances. Their performances were evidence of their efforts. I thank the many parents, grandparents, extended family members and friends who joined us. The children loved performing for you and your attendance is confirmation that what they learn at school is important. Thank you one and all for making the night sensational!

This term, we underwent our **3-Year Peer Review** which provides an opportunity to investigate a focus question which has emerged from our school priorities. Our focus question was "To what extent do the school values impact on student behaviour, learning, and engagement?" Overwhelmingly, it was evident that the school values are having a positive impact on student behaviour. It was affirming to know that the work we began last year as part of our School Annual Improvement Plan is paying off. These actions will have a flow-on effect to student engagement, and we are now implementing strategies specifically targeting learning.

We have great NAPLAN news! Our Year 5 students achieved greater growth in Reading, Spelling, Grammar and Punctuation and Numeracy than the National average. This is an excellent result for our students and testament to the strong foundations our teachers lay for them. Well done!

Today, students celebrated NAIDOC Week. We are grateful to the Mandubarra Rangers for joining us for these celebrations again this year. The Rangers engaged the students in Arts and Crafts, a Dance workshop and a Ranger information session; wonderful opportunities to learn about First Nations culture and histories. Thank you to Miss Priscilla for working with the Rangers to organise the day.

We have several of our senior students finishing the term off with a good dose of sport. Tomorrow, our rugby league enthusiasts will join students from our sister schools for the Jim Graham Cup in Innisfail. On Friday, a team of netballers from Years 4 -6 will travel to Cairns for the Mary Mills Netball Carnival. I wish all players well.

Looking forward, Term 4 will be here and gone before we know it. We start with our Water Confidence lessons and **Swimming Carnival** early in the term, a three-day **camp** for our Year 5/6 class midway through the term and our Christmas concert at the end of the term. This year, we will also host a Christmas Fair. The fair is an opportunity for students to make and sell items, with all profits going to charity. Parents are reminded to check the weekly Parent Flyer for calendar updates.



MTSS-E

Over the past 18 months St John's School has been working through the training for Tier 1 of the Multi-Tiered Systems of Support-Engagement (MTSS-E). This involved establishing a team to oversee the setting up of whole



school systems and practices to enable a unified approach to student engagement by all staff. This also included focusing on universal, **evidenced-based teaching practices** and making sure procedures and routines are clear to staff and students and are followed.

The aim of this process has been to improve student engagement which, in turn, improves their learning. Engagement is a multi-dimensional concept which includes social-emotional, behavioural and cognitive engagement. This has included building relationships and positive connections with our students. We have worked on putting together systems and practices to support positive behaviour and authentic student engagement.

The Whole School Token Reward system has been central to recognising and acknowledging students for their efforts in showing behaviours that reflect our school values and positive behaviour matrix. The system has several layers of acknowledgement for students receiving tokens including individual and whole class rewards. We have 5 students who have earned 10 or more tokens by the end of last week, making them our Super Saints - Evie, Taj, Gabby, Ruby, Michaela and Kisara.

Congratulations to all students for working to earn tokens this term, in the playground and classrooms.

Class in Focus - Year 5/6

This term, Year 5/6 have been exploring changes to the Earth's surface, with a focus on weathering and erosion. Students carried out two hands-on experiments: one demonstrating weathering by shaking rocks and sugar cubes, and the other testing erosion mitigation strategies to understand how and why erosion occurs.

In Maths, students conducted chance experiments to explore the likelihood of different events.

We've loved seeing their enthusiasm for hands-on learning and Ms deBuck and I are especially proud of their creativity and effort in dance.

a map of all the small towns from Murry Upper to Innisfail. our Kindy and St John's community, as well as their home and town communities. Next term we will continue using this map as a tool to help in the transition between Kindergarten and Primary School.




