I have been working across the school teaching our students the foundational skills for interpersonal relationships with their peers. We are focussing on: Understanding ourselves, managing our emotions, setting boundaries, healthy and unhealthy friendships, resolving conflicts, interacting online, bullying, mean on purpose, upstanding behaviours, and encouraging a personal awareness that develops everyone's capacity to engage in respectful, kind, and compassionate relationships with each other. Providing children a voice in their learning is essential and I encourage all families to continue to communicate with our children so we can model, learn, and grow together as a community.
